

**RATE OL—SCHEDULE FOR OUTDOOR SECURITY LIGHTING**

**Availability**

This rate schedule is no longer available after September 1, 2004. Potential lighting customers wanting a lighting system installed and maintained by Company can do so via the Outdoor Lighting Equipment agreement (OLE). Potential customers should contact a Company account representative for further information concerning OLE options. This rate schedule terminates May 1, 2014. Customers currently being provided service under this rate schedule can continue being provided service under this rate schedule until their contract expires or this rate schedule terminates, whichever occurs first.

**Character of Service**

Outdoor security lighting service using lamps available under this schedule.

**Rate\***

For each lamp, controlled by a photoelectric relay, with luminaire and bracket not to exceed 4 feet and including one span of secondary conductor:

When additional facilities not provided for in the above charges are installed by Company, Customer will pay in advance of installation, the cost of such additional facilities which may be required to supply service from the nearest or most suitable existing pole of Company to the point designated by the Customer for the installation of said lamp.

**Reconnection Charge**

When service has been turned off by Company for non-payment of bills, a reconnection charge must be paid by Customer before such service is reconnected. (See Section 12 of General Terms and Conditions for Electric Service).

When service has been disconnected at the Customer's request, a charge may be made by the Company for reconnection of service for the same Customer.

**Hours of Lighting**

All lamps shall burn approximately one-half (1/2) hour after sunset until approximately one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise each day in the year, approximately 4,000 hours per annum.

## RATE OL—SCHEDULE FOR OUTDOOR SECURITY LIGHTING

All facilities installed by the Company for service hereunder including fixtures, controls, poles, transformers, secondary lines, lamps and other appurtenances shall be owned and maintained by Company. All service and necessary maintenance will be performed only during regular scheduled working hours of the Company. Non-operative lamps will normally be restored to service within forty-eight hours after notification by the Customer.

When Customer requests that a lamp be mounted on Customer's building or pole, Customer shall waive any claim for damages caused by the installation and/or removal of secondary and lamp support.

### Special Terms and Conditions

1. Company is in the process of phasing out the availability of the Mercury Vapor Directional Luminaire Lamps. Effective May 17, 1989, these lamps will no longer be installed by Company. Existing Mercury Vapor Directional Luminaire Lamps will be removed from service whenever Company is required to perform maintenance. Customers will have the option of replacing the Mercury Vapor Directional Luminaire Lamps with available lamps under Rate OL or terminating service.
2. Upon this rate schedule's termination, any remaining customers will be offered maintenance, on an annual basis, under an OLE agreement and energy under Rate UOLS.
