**APPLICATION OF DUKE ENERGY CAROLINAS, LLC
FOR APPROVAL OF DECISION TO INCUR NUCLEAR GENERATION
PRE-CONSTRUCTION COSTS**

Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (Duke Energy Carolinas or the Company) has filed an Application with the Public Service Commission of South Carolina (the "Commission") for approval of Duke Energy Carolinas' decision to continue to incur pre-construction costs of up to \$230 million through December 31, 2009, for the Company's proposed William States Lee, III Nuclear Station in Cherokee County, South Carolina (Lee Nuclear Station). The Application was filed pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-33-225. The Application reveals that Duke Energy Carolinas is seeking Commission approval of the decision to incur all pre-construction costs through December 31, 2009, to ensure that the Lee Nuclear Station remains an option to serve customer needs in the 2018 timeframe.

According to the Application, all cost estimates reflect total pre-construction costs to be allocated among South Carolina retail customers, North Carolina retail customers, and wholesale customers (of which the South Carolina portion is approximately 28% or \$64,400,000).

Duke Energy Carolinas' Application cites reasons for the continued development of the Lee Nuclear Station. For example, in each of the past five years, approximately 50,000 new customer accounts have been added and served by Duke Energy Carolinas. Further, the Lee Nuclear Station is the largest single capital project in the history of Duke Energy Carolinas. The Application states that approval of the Company's request will provide additional assurance that the Lee Nuclear Station will continue to be an option to serve the Company's customers in the 2018 timeframe. Additional details regarding the Company's anticipated preconstruction costs and schedule are outlined in its Application.
