**NOTICE TO  
CUSTOMERS**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission entered an Order in Docket No. E-7, Sub 941, on August 3, 2010, approving a change in the Energy Efficiency Rider (Rider EE) charged by Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (Duke), for retail electric service in North Carolina. Rider EE is designed to collect the reasonable and prudent costs incurred by the Company to adopt and implement new demand side management and energy efficiency (DSM/EE) measures authorized by G.S. 62-133.9(d), as well as appropriate incentives approved by the Commission, and to true-up any under-recovery or over-recovery of costs under the rider previously in effect.

As a result of the Commission's Order, Rider EE has been revised and new Rider EE amounts are effective for the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011. The revised Rider EE provides for an increment per kilowatt hour by customer class, as follows, for Calendar Year 2011 (Vintage Year 2) participants: Residential, 0.1702 cents per kWh; Nonresidential EE, 0.0257 cents per kWh; and Nonresidential DSM, 0.0297 cents per kWh. For Nonresidential customers who participated in a DSM or EE program for the period June 1, 2009 to December 31, 2010 (Vintage Year 1), the Order provides for a continuing Rider EE in the amount of 0.0031 cents per kWh.

For customers who are eligible to opt out, the effect of the revised Rider EE amounts will vary depending on opt-out elections. These customers may obtain detailed information about the amounts applicable to their particular circumstances by contacting their Duke account representatives directly or Duke's Customer Service number at 1-800-653-5307.

The impact of this change for a residential customer using 1000 kWh per month is an increase of 50 cents per month compared to the rider previously in effect.
