Where on earth is Mr. Carlos Luria- CIA & The Second Oldest Profession? April 10th at 10 a.m.

Educated in Germany, England and the US, Carlos Luria was recruited by CIA as it geared up to meet the Soviet threat. His career spanned most of the Cold War, and earned him the Career Intelligence Medal. Born in Germany, the CIA recruited him and sent him to Germany. After tours as a field officer he became the executive officer of what in the James Bond movies is designated as "Q" - to be more exact, the 400+ scientists, engineers and technicians who create the technical tools needed for clandestine intelligence collection. As most operations employed one or more of their devices, the position gave him a bird's eye view of the strengths and weaknesses of CIA's operations.
