DukeNet Wins Zoning Approval for 2 New Towers

Last night, DukeNet Communication Services, LLC (“DNCS”) obtained nearly simultaneous zoning approval for two new communication towers located over 100 miles apart. T-Mobile is the anchor tenant for both sites.

One site will be a 130’ monopole located in Greenwood (Johnson County), Indiana at Duke Energy’s Averitt Substation (N39-36-19, W086-07-24). The tower has design capacity for 2 additional carriers at the 110’ & 100’ levels. DNCS builds all towers to EIA/TIA 222-G engineering standards.

The second site will be a 45’ wood utility pole located in Blue Ash (Hamilton County), Ohio. It is designed as a single-carrier site for T-Mobile. Due to the proximity of the site to the Blue Ash Airport, FAA approval of a taller, multi-carrier structure is not obtainable. As a remedy, DNCS has already constructed a single carrier wood utility pole at the site for Sprint and has the ability to obtain additional ground space to accommodate additional single-carrier poles at this location.

DNCS anticipates both sites will be constructed by mid-November.

“The zoning of these two facilities in one night demonstrates the capability of our small team” said Dan Turnpaugh, DNCS Director of Tower Operations. “Providing DNCS employee representation at two zoning hearings on the same night shows our commitment to servicing our customers. We’re pleased that we were successful and are excited to add T-Mobile to our roster of tenants.”
